One way that I have tried to do this is by compiling and distributing information about the various volleyball opportunities in the area. Initially, I started by preparing a calendar of summer volleyball clinics and camps. I then moved on to creating an unbiased, informative website called [NoVA Volleyball Stuff](#) designed to share information on all aspects of the game and at all levels. The website tries to share information on junior house leagues, club volleyball opportunities, and high school volleyball. I also put together calendars of volleyball camps and clinics and outdoor summer volleyball tournaments. In short, I try to break down information in a way that is intended to get new players familiar with the sport and get started playing volleyball.

Having watched the CHRVA Board closely for the past five years, it is very clear to me that it has made vast improvements. There are more opportunities available at all levels of volleyball. The Board has initiated outdoor CHRVA-sponsored Juniors events in cooperation with Fairfax Volleyball, Mid-Atlantic Volleyball, NoPanic Volleyball, and the Baltimore Beach program.

The Board has improved the way information is distributed as well as registration and certification processes. I believe I can help continue these positive trends.
